# To the Indiana High School Athletic Association 

## 

By W. A. Denny

The instinct for play in both men and animals suggests natures means for bringing about certain changes necessary for proper muscular development and maintenance of bodily vigor. To be a good animal is natures prerequisite to future growth, success, or contentment.

It is a striking anomaly that our system of education, which is supposed to equip the individual for the full and complete utilization of his natural powers, has failed to recognize the importance of good health as a fundamental requirement for vigorous mental activity. The predominating factor in the growing youth is the insistent demand for play. If our educational program would take advantage of this natural aptitude and encourage its fuller development by making ample provision for organized play, it would contribute much not only to the physical welfare of the individual but would become a determining influence in his social growth as well. To disregard the educational value of this factor in school life is to lose a powerful agency for the progressive growth of all those mental qualities essential to successful living.

Education implies active participation in group life. The forces involved which consistently direct one's actions toward others, may be learned in playing competitive games according to certain rules of conduct. To win in the struggle of self-control under adverse conditions, to possess the power to respond instantly to changing situations, to cooperate with one's fellows for a common purpose will strengthen the desire for achievement in living.

The sustained effort in competition, the determined struggle for mastery, and the persistent attempt to succeed are excellent qualities for scholastic attainment. The youth who is animated by that splendid spirit of sportsmanship, which allows generous consideration for the good play of an opposing team, will learn well the lesson of tolerance so essential to the perpetuation of our democratic institutions.

As educators we should assume a larger direction of the school's avocacations and not allow the spirit of play to become either atrophied or predominate. We should seek to include an ever increasing number of students within the sphere of its influence. For the worthy use of leisure
may be as important a factor in determining the welfare of the individual as organized work or study.

It is encouraging to note the recent attitude of the State Board of Education in its attempt to incorporate physical training as a requirement in the Course of Study. The efficacy of such teaching is attested by the interest displayed and the phenomenal growth of the Indiana High School Athletic Association which now enrolls five hundred two (502) schools in its list of membership. This branch of organized athletics demands recognition from educators on account of its far reaching influence in the educational policies of the state.

I venture to suggest that the true purpose of the Association could be better served, its scope of activity enlarged, and better service rendered more of the youth of the state by the employment of a secretary who could devote full time to the administration of the details incident thereto. With a membership fee of five dollars ( $\$ 5.00$ ) sufficient funds would be available to finance the program suggested above. This would enable the Athletic Board of Control to coordinate its work more closely with the projected plans outlined by the State Board of Education.


## BASKETBALL

Each succeeding year sees a decided increase in the popularity of this sport as evidenced by the number of High Schools supporting teams throughout the season and by the number of the teams entering the Sectional Tourneys. Probably, better High School Basketball was never played in Indiana than was played this year.

The number of districts holding Sectional Tourneys increased from 16 to 20 and the number of teams participating increased from 204 to 255 . The increase in the number of teams necessitates an increase in the number of Sectional Tourneys and an increase in the number of Sectional Tourneys is causing the State Tourney to be made up of too many teams, thus making the strenuosity of the Tourney a cause for alarm.

The Sectional Tourneys were successes in most places and the Final Tourney was handled in the usual excellent manner by Indiana University. The new gymnasium there accommodated all desiring to see the games. The Lebanon team won the State Championship and Claude Curtis of Martinsville won the Gimbel prize given for "Mental Attitude." - Information in detail follows concerning the Tourneys.

# Announcement of I. H. S. A. A. Sectional and Final Basketball Tourneys, 1917. 

## THE SIXTH ANNUAL

In accordance with the vote of the State Association at the last annual meeting the Board of Control has completed the details for the State Championship Basketball Tourneys and announces the scheme in full.

## SECTIONAL TOURNEYS MARCH 9 and 10

The following bases were used in selecting centers: (1) Locationgeographical and with reference to schools desiring to participate. Railway and Interurban facilities. (3) General conditions-attitude of local authorities, floors, entertaining facilities, etc.

Schools have been assigned by Counties with the intention of having about the same number in each Tourney. The following scheme gives the

Centers and also the Counties assigned to each Center. The name of your County locates yonr Center. The Board reserves the right to readjust the scheme if unforseen conditions make it advisable and necessary. The numbers indicate the schools from each county that have expressed their desire to enter.

Management-The management of these Tourneys rests solely with the Board of Control. Local arrangements have been delegated to the Center Principals. Two officials for each Tourney will be selected by the Board and none but fair, disinterested and competent men will be chosen. All schedules of Hours, Floors, Teams and Officials will be made out and printed by the Board. These schedules will be made by lot and no changes will be made in them.

Open Contest-These Tourneys are open to all members of the Association, irrespective of their season's record.

Protests-All protests against teams or individuals must be made in writing and filed with the Permanent Secretary on or before March 1, at 11 a. $m$. Protests must be accompanied by evidence.

Entertainment-Teams are limited to eight men and ten men can be certified to. The Center Principals have contracted with the Board to entertain nine men (which must include the faculty manager) from each competing school. Entertainment will begin, if necessary at 7 a. m. Friday, March 9 and continue if necessary to 8 a. m., Sunday, March 11. Printed schedules will be sent to each competing school in plenty of time to arrange for making the trip, etc. All competing schools are requested to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary.

Expenses-An entrance fee of one (1) dollar for each team must accompany the entry blank, which money will go into the treasury of the I. H. S. A. A. to defray expenses of the Tourneys incurred by the Board of Control. The Center Principals have contracted to pay transportation expenses of the competing schools according to the following conditions:

After all expenses, save those of transportation, have been paid a balance shall be ascertained. The first one hundred (100) dollars or part thereof in this balance shall belong to the Center Principal. If there is more than one hundred (100) dollars in the balance the transportation expenses of the competing schools shall be paid or such part thereof as the balance prorated will
give each school, the Tourney Center not sharing. Any balance yet remaining shall belong to the Center Principal after $\$ 50$ is paid to the I. H. S. A. A.

Privileges-All competing teams, one rubber, and one faculty manager from each team, are to be admitted free to all games.

Eligibility -The eligibility of each player must be certified to by the Principal of the school sending the team. Certificates must be made on the regular blanks furnished by the Permanent Secretary, and all data must be given as indicated. Entries will close Thursday, March 1. This means that they must be in the hands of the Permanent Secretary complete in every detail on that date.

Admission Fee-The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and one (1) dollar for season tickets and no more shall be received for said tickets. No more tickets shall be sold than the capacity of the house will justify.

Prizes-No prizes of any kind are to be awarded to any school or individual.

Distribution of Tickets-An equitable distribution of tickets shall be made among the competing schools based on distance, enrollment in High School, and probable attendance from the competing schools. Any unfair methods or prices higher than those mentioned in this announcement should be reported to the Board of Control with evidence.

Warnings-Entries close Thursday, March 1 and cannot be changed afterwards. An entrance fee of $\$ 1.00$ must accompany each entry blank. Special privileges will not be granted to any one. Send all entry blanks and mohey to A. L. Trester, Martinsville, Indiana. All data must be given on entry blank.

## FINAL TOURNEY, BLOOMINGTON, MARCH 16 AND 17

Entrants-The winning teams of the Sectional Tourneys shall constitute the participants in the final Tourney.

Entries-Teams are limited to eight men and ten men can be certified to. These teams may or may not be made up of the same men that participated in the Sectional Tourneys. Certificates must be made on the regular blanks furnished by the Permanent Secretary, and all data must be given as indicated. These are due in the hands of the Permanent Secretary on Tuesday, March 13, complete in every detail. One entry fee covers both Sectional and Final Tourneys.

Entertainment-Indiana University has contracted with the Board to entertain nine men (which must include the faculty manager) from each school. Entertainment will begin, if necessary, at 6 p. m. Thursday, March

15 and continue, if necessary, to $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Sunday, March 18. All competing schools are requested to ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary. Traveling will be at the expense of the competing schools.

Admission Fee-The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and one (1) dollar for season tickets.

Warnings-Entries are due Tuesday, March 13 and cannot be changed afterwards. Special privileges will not be granted to any one. Send all entry blanks to A. L. Trester, Martinsville, Indiana. All data must be given. The management, protests, and privileges will be governed according to the regulations pertaining to the Sectional Tourneys.

Prizes-Indiana University will award the winning school a shield or similiar trophy, and each member of its team an individual trophy. No other prizes shall be awarded.

## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT

Martinsville, Indiana, 1917
The following articles of agreement are subscribed to by the Board of Control of the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and Principal representing

High School.

## Section I

The dates of the Indiana Sectional High School Basket Ball Tourneys shall be Friday and Saturday, March 9 and 10, 1917.

Section II
The State High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish the High School representative with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams, on or before Monday, March 5.

## Section III

The High School representative shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of nine men, which shall include one Faculty Manager for each team, between the hours of 7 A . M. Friday, March 9 , and 8 A . M. Sunday, March 11. If possible this period of entertainment will be shortened by the Board of Control.

## Section IV

The High School representative shall provide tickets, door-men, ushers, announcers, scorers, timekeepers, basket balls, and all necessary equipment for the games. No prizes whatever are to be given.

## Section V

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the High School representative, who shall issue them to the Press, the officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, are to be admitted free to the Tourney.

## Section VI

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control shall select the officials for the games not included in Section IV.

## Section VII

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and one (\$1) dollar for season tickets.

## Section VIII

The High School representative shall pay to each Referee at the close of his work the sum of twenty-five (25) dollars. There will be two Referees assigned to each Tourney.

## Section IX

After all expenses, save those for travel of the competing teams, have been paid a balance shall be ascertained, and if such proves to be more than one hundred (100) dollars the transportation expenses of the competing schools shall be paid by the High School Representative. If the amount of the balance above one hundred (100) dollars is not sufficient to pay all of the transportation expenses, this amount shall be distributed pro rata among the competing schools, the Center school not sharing in this distribution. If the amount above one hundred ( 100 ) dollars is more than sufficient to pay all of the transportation expenses, this amount shall be divided as follows: The first $\$ 50.00$ or part thereof shall go to the I. H. S. A. A. and the remainder shall belong to the High School Representative. The one hundred (100) dollars referred to above shall belong to the High School Representative.

## Section X

The High School under whose auspices the Tourney is held promises hearty co-operation with the State Board of Control and the State Board of Control promises as much to the High School conducting the Tourney.

## Section XI

The details of all Tourneys such as protests, eligibility lists, schedules, etc., are to be cared for by the State Board of Control.

## Section XII

The State Board of Control shall manage all Tourneys, and the High Schools are to work under this direction.

## Section XIII

The High School representative shall send by telegram the name of the winning school to A. L. Trester, Martinsville, Indiana, as soon as the Tournament is completed. The High School representative shall also send to A. L. Trester on or before Wednesday, March 14, the complete scores of all games, as well as copies of the local papers having comments upon the Tourney. A complete and itemized statement of the receipts and disbursements shall be sent on or before this date. A check calling for $\$ 6.00$ to cover the printing of the Schedules and fifty (50) dollars as called for in Section IX, shall be sent upon this date, too.

Section V

## Section VI

The I. H. S. A. A. agrees to furnish the official full details on March 6 or sooner.

## Section VII

Spalding's Official Basketball Rules for 1916-17 shall govern all games. These rules are to be enforced rigidly and fairly, thus eliminating roughness and unclean playing at all times. Principals will be asked to report on the work of the officials.

## Section VIII

This proposition must be signed by both parties and returned on or before to be binding.

## STATE SECTIONAL BASKETBALL TOURNAMENTS

## Of the Indiana High School Athletic Association March 9 and 10, 1917.

## THE SIXTH ANNUAL

Tourneys will be held at Anderson, Bloomington, Bluffton, Brazil, Columbus, Crawfordsville, Franklin, Greencastle, Kendallville, Kokomo, Lafayette, Lebanon, Logansport, Martinsville, New Castle, Richmond, South Bend, Valparaiso, Vincennes and Washington.

Teams must be on floor as scheduled under penalty of forfeiture of game.
No changes will be made in the schedule and no substitutions of nonentered players will be permitted. Eight of the players on the certified entry blank must constitute the team and these must be chosen prior to the opening game.

The official entry list will be in the hands of the Principal at all times and shall constitute final evidence in all cases. Players will be subject to identification at any time.

Teams are limited to eight men and must be in charge of a Faculty Manager, who will be held responsible for the students and their conduct.

Spalding's Official Guide for 1916-17 shall govern.
The officials have been assigned by the Board and no changes will be made. Their decisions will be final.

The admission fee to all Tourney games shall not be more than 25 c for single session tickets and $\$ 1.00$ for season tickets.

The winning team in each Tourney will participate in the Final Tourney at Bloomington, March 16 and 17. Entry blanks are due on Tuesday, March 13 , complete in every detail. The Sectional entry blank will serve for the State entry blank if information to this effect is received by the Permanent Secretary on or before March 13.

Entertainment, board and lodging, for nine men from each competing school begins, if necessary, at $7 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Friday, and continues, if necessary, to $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Sunday. Kindly ask for no longer entertainment than is necessary.

Transportation expenses will be paid according to the plan outlined in the announcement of January 25.

Nine complimentary tickets will be issued to each Faculty Manager, admitting to all games. Managers should call for these upon arrival. These tickets are not transferable.

Communications with the Board during the Tourneys should be carried on through A. L. Trester. If you observe this, business will be expedited.

The Center Principal will be the local manager and all should cooperate with him in carrying on a successful Tourney.

## I. H. S. A. A. FINAL BASKETBALL TOURNAMENT CONTRACT

## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT

Martinsville, Indiana, Jan. 22, 1917
The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and U. H. Smith, representing Indiana University.

## Section I

The dates of the Indiana High School Basket Ball Tourney shall be March 16 and 17 at Bloomington, Indiana, on the University floors.

## Section II

The High School Board of Control through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, shall furnish U. H. Smith with lists of qualified teams and the names of the men on the respective teams, on or before Wednesday, March 14.

## Section III

U. H. Smith shall provide free entertainment for the respective teams of eight men each, together with one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, between the hours of 6 P. M. Thursday, March 15, and 8 A. M. Sunday, March 18.

## Section IV

The Indiana University representative shall provide tickets, gate men, announcers, scorers, timekeepers and all necessary equipment for the Tourney. He shall further provide a suitable shield for the school winning the Tourney and badges for the individual members of the winning team. The standard design of the I. H. S. A. A. shall be used.

## Section V

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the University representative, who shall issue them to the representatives of the Press, the University officials, and to the helping students. The men of the competing teams with one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, are to be admitted free to the Tourney. The members of the Board of Control and the Permanent Secretary shall be furnished with official badges and reserved seats.

## Section VI

The High School Board of Control shall choose the officials other than those mentioned in Section IV.

## Section VII

The admission fee shall be twenty-five (25) cents for single session tickets and one ( $\$ 1$ ) dollar for season tickets.

## Section VIII

The University representative, U. H. Smith shall pay to the Treasurer of the High School Board of Control, E. E. Ramsey, one hundred (\$100) dollars at the close of the Tourney. If there should be a balance in the hands of the University representative at the end of the Tourney after all expenses have been paid this balance shall be divided on the basis of $50 \%$ to the Board of Control and $50 \%$ to the University. The expense item incurred by a banquet to the teams shall be borne by the University.

## Section IX

Indiana University shall pay thirty ( $\$ 30$ ) dollars each to the two officials chosen by the Board of Control and also expenses of the Board of Control incurred on account of the Tourney. All expense accounts shall be submitted by both parties at the time of settlement.

## TRACK, FIELD AND BASEBALL

The war situation and a late spring combined caused these sports to lose somewhat in their hold upon the High Schools of the State. There were a number of good dual, triangular and other meets and games, however, and sectional meets were given their first try-out in the I. H. S. A. A. The second Baseball Tourney in the history of the Association was held also.

There were ten Sectional meets and all but two were losing ventures financially. They were very successful otherwise, however, and the State Meet was the best in years due to elimination of incompetents. Fifty-three schools were represented in the State Meet and 21 received some points. Five Association records were broken. There were six Baseball teams competing, thus showing that this sport is not popular among the High Schools.

Purdue University under whose auspices this Meet and Tourney were held proved to be an excellent host in all particulars. The method of elimination by holding sectional meets proved successful and in a few years this scheme will be working as well as the Basketball scheme. The medal proposition was expensive and unnecessary. Trophies have been barred from future meets, however, so all meets should easily pay expenses. Information in full follows:


# Detailed Announcements for Track Meets 'and Baseball Tourney, 1917 

## THE FIRST ANNUAL

In accordance with the vote of the State Association at the last annual meeting, the Board of Control has completed the details for the State Sectional and Final Track and Field Meets together with the details for the Open State Baseball Tourney. The scheme in full follows:

Eligibility - Each contestant in these meets must have previously made in a fair test a record equal to the following in every event in which he is entered:
100 Yard Dash ..... 11 s.
220 Yard Dash ..... 26 s .
440 Yard Dash ..... 58 s.
Half Mile Run 2 min .20 s.
Mile Run ..... 5 min .15 s.
120 Yard High Hurdles ..... 19 s.
220 Yard Low Hurdles ..... 29 s .
Running High Jump ..... 5 ft .
Running Broad Jump ..... 19 ft .
Pole Vault ..... 8 ft .9 in .
Putting Shot ( 12 lb. ) ..... 36 ft .

The above, together with a mile relay, will constitute the events of the Meets. Winning first place in any event counts five points; second place, three points; and third place, one point. Points in the relay will not be counted in determining the winning team. In case of a tie in any event the points shall be divided and the place awarded by lot.

The order of events is as follows:
Track Events-100-yard dash trial; 120 -yard hurdle trial; 100 yard dash final; one mile run; 440 -yard run; 120 -yard hurdle final; 220-yard dash trial; 220-yard hurdle trial; 880 -yard run; 220 -yard dash final; 220 -yard hurdle final; relay.
Field Events-Running high jump; shot put; pole vault; running broad jump.

Saturday, May 19. If possible this period of entertainment will be shortened by the Board of Control.

## Section IV

The High School representative shall provide tickets, announcers, scorers, timekeepers, judges and all necessary equipment and officials for the Meet, other than those mentioned in Section VI.

## Section V

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of the High School representative, who shall issue them to the Press, the officials, and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber and one Faculty Manager for each team, are to be admitted free to the Meet.

## Section <br> VI

The I. H. S. A. A. Board of Control shall select the Referee and Starter.

## Section VII

The admission fee to all Meets shall be twenty-five (25) cents.

## Section VIII

The High School representative shall pay to each Referee and to each Starter at the close of his work the sum of ten (\$10) dollars only.

Section IX
The proceeds of the Meet after meeting the items mentioned in the several sections of this contract shall belong to the High School entertaining the Meet.

## Section X

The details of all Meets such as protests, eligibility lists, schedules, etc., are to be cared for by the State Board of Control.

## Section XII

The State Board of Control shall manage all Meets, and the High Schools are to work under this direction.

## Section XIII

The High School representative shall send a complete program of the Meet containing all winners, records, distances, etc., by special delivery immediately after the close of the Meet, Saturday, May 19. This is very necessary for Final Meet purposes. A complete and itemized statement of the receipts and disbursements shall be sent on Monday, May 19.

The High School Principal holding the Meet shall pay this amonut to the official at the close of the Meet.

## Section III

agrees to co-operate with the Board of Control and the competing teams to make the Meet fair in every way. The I. H. S. A. A. agrees to arrange a schedule of hours, teams, floors, officials, etc., and this schedule must not be changed by any one save the I.H.S. A.A. The order of events as given in the annual Hand Book must be followed carefully.

## Section IV

The I. H. S. A. A. will furnish a Referee and a Starter for each Meet. The other officials will be furnished by the Center Principal.

Section V
The I. H. S. A. A. will designate the place to work, with the assurance now that it will be as near to the officials home as thought best for all concerned.

Section VI
The I. H. S. A. A. agrees to furnish the official full details on May 14 or sooner.

## Section VII

The rules of the Western Inter-Collegiate Amateur Athletic Association shall govern except in cases of modification by the Board of Control. These latter rules, as adopted by the Board, may be found in the I. H. S. A. A. Hand Book. These rules are to be enforced rigidly and fairly. Principals will be asked to report on the work of the officials.

## Section VIII

This proposition must be signed by both parties and returned on or before to be binding.

## ARTICLES OF CONTRACT

Martinsville, Ind., March 23, 1917

The following Articles of Agreement are subscribed to by the Indiana High School Athletic Association through A. L. Trester, Permanent Secretary, and O. F. Cutts representing Purdue University.

## Section I

The dates of the Indiana High School Baseball Tourney and the Track and Field Meet shall be Friday and Saturday, May 25 and 26 , respectively. The Baseball Tourney shall begin at noon Friday (unless the number of entries makes it necessary to begin earlier) and continue no further than noon Saturday. The Track and Field Meet shall be held Saturday afternoon, May 26.

## Section II

The Indiana High School Board of Control through its Permanent Secretary shall furnish O. F. Cutts with lists of qualified teams and the names and events of the men on the respective teams, on or before Monday, May 21, 1917.

## Section III

O. F. Cutts shall provide entertainment for the respective Baseball teams including one Faculty Manager for each team of 12 players between the hours of $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Friday, May 25 and $1 \mathrm{p} . \mathrm{m}$. Saturday, May 26. If the number of entries necessitates, entertainment shall begin sooner.

He shall also provide entertainment for all of the men in 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in the Sectional Track and Field Meets; for five men constituting the winning relay team in each Sectional Meet; between the hours of $8 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. Saturday, May 26, and for a Faculty Manager for each school represented until 8 a. m. Sunday, May 27, if necessary.

## Section IV

O. F. Cutts shall provide tickets, gate men, announcer, scorers, timekeepers, judges, umpires, and all necessary equipment for the Meet. He shall further provide a suitable cup for the school winning the Baseball Tourney and individual buttons for the 12 members of the winning team. For the Track and Field Meet he shall provide a suitable cup for the school winning the Meet, a placque for the winning relay team and individual buttons for point winners. No other prizes shall be given.

## Section V

The matter of complimentary tickets shall be in the hands of O. F. Cutts, who shall issue them to the representatives of the Press, one umpire for each game of Baseball, officials, faculty managers and to the helping students. All men of the competing teams, one rubber and one faculty manager for each team are to be admitted free to the Meet. The members of the Board of Control and the Permanent Secretary shall be furnished with official badges and reserved seats near the finishing line.

The Board of Control has gone on record against the presence of coaches and other representatives from colleges and universities proselyting at the contests of the I. H. S. A. A. Such is not permitted at this Tourney and Meet.

## Section VI

The Indiana High School Board of Control shall sanction the choice of the Referee and the Starter chosen by Purdue University. The Referee must be an A. A. U. man. The Baseball umpires shall be chosen by Purdue University.

## Section VII

The admission fee shall be twenty-five (25) cents for each session of the Baseball Tourney and fifty (50) cents for the Track Meet.

## Section VIII

The University representative, O. F. Cutts, shall pay one hundred twenty-five (\$125) dollars to A. L. Trester of the I. H. S. A. A. at the close of the Meet.

## Section IX

Separate financial statements covering all receipts and expenditures of the Tourney and the Meet shall be sent to A. L. Trester by O. F. Cutts on or before Wednesday, May 30.

## Board Meeting

The Board of Control of the I. H. S. A. A. met in the Claypool Hotel, Indianapolis, at 10:30 o'clock, November 25. Mr. Denny, Mr. Shock and the Permanent Secretary being present.

The following decisions were rendered:
The Evansville High School was suspended until June 1, 1917, for playing an ineligible boy knowingly on their football team.

The Oolitic-Owensburg controversy was settled by disqualifying Gilbert Babbe, of Owensburg, for this entire Basketball season.

Coalmont High School was suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until April 1, 1917, for playing a non-member of the State Association.

The Linton-Garfield controversy was settled by exonerating Principal Records of Garfield.

The Holton-Napoleon game won by Holton was forfeited to Napoleon and George Jackson of the Holton High School was declared ineligible for this entire semester. The above action was taken because George Jackson did not enter High School during the first twenty days of the semester.

The New Amsterdam-Depauw controversy was settled by declaring the score as follows: New Amsterdam, 11; Depauw, 5.

The coaching system of Basketball in the Bloomington High School must be changed immediately under penalty of suspension.

The Board furthermore accepted the invitation of Purdue University to hold a Baseball Tournament in connection with the State Track Meet on May 25 or 26.

There being no further business the meeting adjourned.

## Board Meeting

The Board of Control met in the Claypool Hotel, Indianapolis, at 10:30 a. m. Thursday, December 28. Supt. Denny, Prin. E. E. Ramsey and the Pernaanent Secretary being present.

Prin. Records of the Garfield High School, Terre Haute, and Mr. White,

Sporting Editor of the Terre Haute Tribune were present and asked permission to hold a Basketball Tourney made up of Indiana and Illinois High Schools on January 26 and 27, 1917. Sanction was given with the following provisions:

1. The three High Schools of Terre Haute shall signify in writing to the State Board of Control their approval and support of the proposed Wabash Valley Athletic Association Basketball Tourney.
2. All financial arrangements shall conform strictly to the usual I. H. S. A. A. Basketball Tourney regulations.
3. All I. H. S. A. A. rules shall be observed and conformity given thereto.
The Ladoga High School must change her coaching system immediately under penalty of suspension.

The Scottsburg-Jeffersenville controversy over the cancellation of a game was settled by removing any blame from Jeffersonville since the Scottsburg floor is a concrete one.

The Permanent Secretary was instructed to arrange contracts with both Indiana University and Purdue University for the Basketball Tourney and the Baseball and Track Meet respectively.

The Centerville High School-was suspended until June 1, 1917, for playing ineligible men.

The Winamac-North Bend controversy was settled by declaring a forfeiture of $\$ 10.00$ due Winamac for each of two games of Basketball scheduled by North Bend according to contracts submitted. This sum of $\$ 20.00$ must be paid on or before January 10.

Upon reconsideration the suspension of the Coalmont High School was set at February 1 rather than April 1, providing Coalmont played no ineligible ball in the meantime.

## Board Meeting

The Board met at 6:00 p. m. in the Claypool Hotel, Indianapolis, Saturday, January 20. The entire new Board and the Permanent Secretary were present. Organization of the Board for the year was made as follows: Supt. W. A. Denny, President, and Prin. E. E. Ramsey, Treasurer.

Mr, U. H. Smith and Coach Steihm of Indiana University were present and the details of the State Final Basketball Tourney were completed.
C. B. Dyer of Indianapolis submitted a design for I. H. S. A. A. medals and it was adopted as the standard design of the Association for all medals and trophies.

It was unanimously voted that at all future Basketball Tourneys, Baseball Tourneys, Track Meets, etc., whether sectional or final, none but con-
testants, rubbers, officials and managers shall be allowed on the floors or fields.

John Musselman of Newberry was declared a non-official under the rules of the I. H. S. A. A. until June 1, 1917, for unbecoming conduct in a game of Basketball.

Middletown was ordered to pay Hagerstown $\$ 10.00$ on or before January 27 for failure to play one game as scheduled and Hagerstown was ordered to drop the charge concerning another game as scheduled. The compromise was made because of indefinite negotiations on the part of these two schools.

North Bend High School was denied membership in the I. H. S. A. A. until they paid $\$ 20.00$ forfeit money to Winamac for failure to play two games of Basketball as scheduled.

The Permanent Secretary was ordered to write to the Milan High School stating that technically they could hold the Patriot High School for $\$ 10.00$ forfeit money but owing to the distance and weather conditions Milan should not ask compliance with the provisions of the contract.

Veedersburg and Newtown were both held blameworthy in a recent controversy. Newtown should have used the official agreed upon and Veedersburg should have played the game under protest. The contest was declared no game and thus settled.

The Permanent Secretary was ordered to ask Prin. Thos. Records of Terre Haute to give him an interview at Martinsville soon concerning the proposed Tourney to be held at Terre Haute.

It was decided to withhold sanction from a County Basketball Tourney proposed by Manager Ellis of De Pauw University and to warn all schools that their membership would lapse if they participated in the Tourney.

Contracts for the Final Basketball Tourney, the Sectional Tourneys, the Basketball officials and the State Track Meet were gone over and the articles agreed upon.

Agreement was reached concerning the announcement for the Basketball Tourneys also.

The Preparatory School of Winona College was denied admission into the I. H. S. A. A. because of difficulty in determining eligibility requirements.

The following Sectional Centers were chosen for Basketball: Anderson, Bloomington, Bluffton, Brazil, Columbus, Crawfordsville, Franklin, Greencastle, Kendallville, Kokomo, Lafayette, Lebanon or Delphi or Frankfort, Logansport, Martinsville, New Castle, Richmond, South Bend, Valparaiso, Vincennes, Washington.

## Board Meeting

The Board of Control met at the Severin Hotel Saturday, April 7, at 11 a. m., all members except Mr. Ramsey being present.

Supt. Stonecipher and Mr. Edwards of Zionsville were present to protest
the officiating of Mr. Moloney in a game between Thorntown and Zionsville during the Sectional Tourney at Lebanon. After consideration by the Board no action was deemed necessary.

Director Cutts of Purdue University was present and the details of the State Baseball Tourney and the State Track and Field Meet were worked over carefully.

The probable entries in the Tourney and the Meet were gone over with a view to assigning them to centers. The invitations of Gary, Lafayette, Huntington, Martinsville and Linton were accepted and the Permanent Secretary was instructed to get contracts with these schools. The Permanent Secretary was also instructed to secure other invitations as the number and location of the schools desiring to enter demanded.

The officials for the Sectional Meets were discussed and several men were recommended by the members of the Board. The Permanent Secretary was instructed to secure a Referee and a Starter for each sectional meet.

The Board adjourned to meet at $10 \mathrm{a} . \mathrm{m}$. at the Severin Hotel Saturday, April 14.

## Fifteenth Annual Meeting

Director Cutts of Purdue, and Mr. Sollitt of I. U., invited the Association to hold the Annual Basketball Tourney at Purdue and Indiana University respectively. The vote stood as follows: Purdue 56, Indiana 89. A motion that the State be divided into north and south tourneys was lost.

An amendment was offered making it necessary for a student to be enrolled in a new school for one semester before being eligible to participate in athletics. It was tabled.

Mr. Smelser, chairman of the Committee on Dangerous Sports, made a report that the sports as they now stand are all right.

An attempt to reinstate the discus failed when put to a vote.
An amendment regarding the standardization of the giving of athletic letters was lost.

The Association approved the plan of the State Board of Education to secure a Course of Study in Physical Training for all boys and girls.

The Association voted to hold Sectional Track Meets with a State Final Meet. All trophies were barred from the Sectional Track Meets.

Upon motion by Superintendent Hines a vote of confidence was given the Board of Control for its efficient and fair-minded work.

An amendment limiting all athletic coaches to members of the teaching corps was lost.

The Permanent Secretary was instructed to secure an opinion on the war tax as it concerns tickets for athletic sports and report the same to all members of the I. H. S. A. A.

## Board Meeting

A Board Meeting was held in the Washington Hotel at 6 p. m. November 1 , all members and the Permanent Secretary being present. -

It was decided that students in Junior High Schools were not eligible to
belong to both the Junior and the Senior High School teams. Ninth year students are eligible for the Senior High School athletics as the four years of opportunity begins with the ninth year.

The Camden-Deer Creek controversy was considered and the Permanent Secretary was instructed to secure additional data bearing on the difficulty.

The Orleans-Mitchell game was considered and it was found that Orleans played two ineligible men on their second team. Orleans High School was suspended from the I. H. S. A. A. until January 1, 1918.

The strenuosity of the Sectional and Final Basketball Tourneys was considered and each member of the Board was instructed to form some plan for relieving this situation and to report same at our next meeting.

Two or more inspectors.
Three or more field judges.
Three judges at finish.
Three or more timekeepers.
One starter.
One clerk of the course.
One scorer.
One marshal.
Sec. 2. If deemed necessary, assistants may be provided for the clerk of the course, the scorer and the marshal, and an official announcer may be appointed.

## RULE II.

## The Board of Control.

The Board of Control shall have jurisdiction of all matters not assigned by these rules to the referee or other game officials.

## RULE III.

## The Referee.

The referee must decide all questions relating to the actual conduct of the Meet, whose final settlement is not otherwise covered by these rules, and shall have the power to add to or alter the announced arrangements of heats in any event. A referee has no authority, after heats have been drawn and published in a program, to transfer a contestant from one heat to another.

When in any but the final heat of a race a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to culpable carelessness, and shall also have power to allow the hindered competitor to start in the next round of heats, just as if he had been placed in his trial.

When in a final heat a claim of foul or interference is made, he shall have the power to disqualify the competitor who was at fault, if he considers the foul intentional or due to his carlessness or conduct, and he shall also have the power to order a new race between such of the competitors as he thinks entitled to such a privilege.

If during the athletic contest under the rules of the I. H.S. A. A. a competitor shall conduct himself in a manner unbecoming a gentleman or offensive to the officials, spectators or competitors, the referee shall have the power to disqualify him from further competition at the Meet; and if he thinks the offense worthy of additional punishment, must promptly make a detailed statement of the facts to the Board of Control.

Power to change the order of events as laid down in the official program is reserved to the Board of Control, which shall, through its chairman, exercise this authority, unless it sees fit to expressly delegate this power to the referee.

The referee shall not have authority to disqualify any competitor for violation of the eligibility rule of the I. H.S.A. A. All protests as to eligibility made on the field must be referred to the Board of Control, and the protested competitor must be allowed to compete until disqualified by the arbitrator of the I. H. S. A. A.

## RULE IV

## The Inspectors.

It shall be the duty of the inspector to stand at such point as the referee may designate, to watch the competition closely, and, in case of claim of foul, to report to the referee what he saw of the incident. Such inspectors are merely assistants to the referee, to whom they must report, and have no power to make any decision.

## RULE V.

## The Judges of the Finish.

The judges of the finish must determine the order of finishing of contestants, and must arrange among themselves as to noting the winner, second, third and fourth, etc., as the case may require, and there must always betwo judges, whose duty must be to choose the winner.

Their decision in this respect must be without appeal, and in case of a disagreement a majority must govern.

## RULE VI.

## The Field Judges.

The field judges must make an accurate measurement and keep a tally of all trials of competitors in the high and broad jumps, the pole vaults, the weight competitions and the discus throws.

They must act as judges in these events, and their decisions must likewise be without appeal. In case of disagreement, a majority must govern. There must be at least three judges for every event.

## RULE VII.

## The Timekeepers.

The timekeepers must be three in number, and must individually time all events where time record is called for. At the conclusion of each heat, each timekeeper must present his watch to the referee for inspection, and he must decide the official time. Should two of the three watches mark the same time and the third disagree, the time marked by said two watches must be accepted. Should all three disagree, the time marked by the intermediate watch must be accetped.

The flash of the pistol must denote the actual time of starting.
If, for any reason, only two watches are held on any event, and they fail to agree, the longer time of the two must be accepted.

## RULE VIII.

## The Starter.

The starter must have sole jurisdiction over the competitors after the clerk of the course has properly placed them in their position for the start.

The method of starting must be by pistol report, except that in time handicap races the word "go" must be used.

An actual start is not effected until the pistol has been purposely discharged after the competitors have been warned to get ready.

In case the pistol was not purposely discharged, the competitors shall be called back by the starter by pistol fire.

Note-The starter must have at least two good cartridges in his pistol before starting a heat.

When any part of the person of a competitor touches the ground in front of his mark before the signal is given, it must be considered a false start.

Penalties for false starling must be inflicted by the starter, as follows: In all races to and including 125 yards, the competitor must be put back one yard for the first and another yard for the second attempt; in races over 125 yards and including 300 yards, two yards for the first and two more for the second attempt; in races over 300 yards and including 600 yards, three yards for the first and three more for the second attempt; in races over 600 yards and including 1,000 yards, four yards for the first and four more for the sec-
ond attempt; in races over 1,000 yards and including one mile, five yards for the first and five more for the second attempt; in all races over one mile, ten yards for the first attempt and ten more for the second attempt.

In all cases, the third false start must prevent his competing in that event.
The starter must rule out of that event any competitor who attempts to advance himself from his mark, as perscribed in the official program, after he has been given the warning to "get ready."

RULE IX.

## Clerk of the Course.

The clerk of the course must be provided with the names and tne num. bers of all entered competitors, ard he must notify them to appear at the starting line before the start in each event in which they are entered.

## RULE X. <br> The Scorer.

The scorer must record the order in which each competitor finishes his event, together with the time furnished by the referee.

He must keep a tally of the laps made by each competitor in races covering nore than one lap, and must announce, by means of a bell or otherwise, when the leading man enters the last lap.

He must draw up a list of the actual competitors in each event, which shall be filed with the papers of the Association, and shall be the official record of competing entrants, and shall be final evidence in the enforcement of Rule III, of the rules of eligibility.

He must control his assistants and assign to them such of his duties as he may deem proper.

## RULE XI. <br> The Marshal.

The marshal must have police charge of the enclosure, and must prevent any but officers and actual competitors from entering or remaining therein.

He must control his assistants and assign to thẹm their duties.

## RULE XII.

The Official Announcer.
The official announcer must receive from the scorer and field judges the result of each event, and announce the same by voice or by means of a bulletin board.

## RULE XIII.

## Competitors.

Competitors must report to the Clerk of the Course immediately upon their arrival at the place of meeting, and must be provided by that official with their proper numbers, which must be worn conspicuously by the competitors when competing, and without which they must not be allowed to start.

Each competitor must inform himself of the time of starting, and must be promptly at the starting point of each competition in which he is entered, and there report to the Clerk of the Course.

Under no condition shall attendants be allowed to accompany competitors at the start or during any competition.

## RULE XIV.

## Track Measurement.

All distances run or walked must be measured upon a line eighteen inches outward from the inner edge of the track, except that in races on straightaway tracks the distance must be measured in a direct line from the starting mark to the finishing line.

## RULE XV.

## The Course.

Each competitor must keep in his respective position from start to finish in all races on straightaway tracks, and in all races on tracks with one or more turns, he must not cross to the inner edge of the track, except when he is at least six feet in advance of his nearest competitor. After turning the last corner into the straight in any race, each competitor must run a straight course to the finish line, and must not cross to either the outside or inside from such straight course in front of his opponents.

In all races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

The referee must disqualify from that event any competitor who willfully pushes against, impedes, crosses the course of, or in any way interferes with another competitor.

The referee must disqualify from further participation in the Meet any contestant competing to lose, to coach, or in any way impede the chances of another competitor, either in a trial or a final contest.

## RULE XVI.

## The Finish.

The finish of the course must be represented by a line between two finishing posts, drawn across and at right angles to the sides of the track, and four feet above which line must be stretched a tape, attached at either end to the fiinishing posts. A finish must be counted when any part of the winners body, except his hands or arms, touches the tape at the finishing line. The tape must be considered the finishing line for the winners, but their order of finishing across the track line must determine the position of the other competitors.

## RULE XVII.

## Hurdles.

In the 120 yards hurdle race, ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be three feet six inches high. They must be placed ten yards apart, with the first hurdle fifteen yards distant from the starting point, and the last hurdle fifteen yards before the finishing line.

In the 220 yards hurdle race ten hurdles must be used, each hurdle to be two feet six inches high. They must be placed twenty yards apart, with the first hurdle twenty yards distant from the starting mark, and the last hurdle twenty yards before the finishing line.

In making a record it must be necessary for the competitor to jump every hurdle in its proper position.

In all hurdle races of the I. H. S. A. A. up to and including 220 yards, each competitor must have separate hurdles and a separate course marked out and measured, whether races are run straightaway or with turns.

A competitor knocking down three or more hurdles, or any portion of three or more hurdles, in any race shall be disqualified.

## RULE XVIII. Jumping.

Section 1. A fair jump must be one that is made without the assistance of weights, diving, somersaults, or handsprings of any kind.

In scratch events competitors must jump in order as placed on program.
Sec. 2. The running high jump.-The field judges must decide the height at which the jumpshall commence, and must regulate the succeeding elevations.

Each competitor must be allowed three trial jumps at each height, and if on the third trial he shall fail, he must be declared out of the competition.

Competitors must jump in order, as provided in Section 1; then those failing, if any, must have their second trial jump in a like order, after which those who have faild twice must make their third trial jump.

The jump must be made over a bar resting on pins projecting not more than three inches from the uprights, and when this bar is removed from its place by the competitor when trying, it must be counted as a trial jump.

Running under the bar in making an attempt to jump must be counted as a "balk," and three successive "balks," must be counted as a trial jump.

The distance of the run before the jump must be unlimited. A competitor may decline to jump at any height in his turn, and by so doing forfeits his rights to again•jump at the height declined.

Sec. 4. The running broad jump.-When jumped on earth, a joist five inches wide must be sunk flush with it. The outer edges of this joist must be called the scratch line, and the measurement of all jumps must be made
from it, at right angles, to the nearest break in the ground made by any part of the person of the competitor.

In front of the scratch line the ground must be removed to the depth of three and the width of twelve inches outward.

A foul jump must be one where the competitor, in jumping cff the scratch line, makes a mark on the ground immediately in front of it, or runs over the line without jumping, and must count as a trial jump without results.

Each Competitor must have three trial jumps, and the best three must have three more trial jumps.

The competition must be decided by the best of all the jumps of the competitors.

The distance of the run before the scratch line must be unlimited.
Sec. 5. The pole vault.- A pole must be furnished by the managing committee, but contestants may use their own private poles if they so desire, and no contestant shall be allowed to use any of these private poles except by the consent of their owners. The poles must be unlimited as to size and weight, but must have no assisting devices, except that they may be wrapped or covered with any substance (to obtain a firmer grip,) and may have one prong at the end.

No competitor shall, during the vault, raise the hand which was uppermost when he left the ground to a higher point of the pole, nor shall he raise the hand which was undermost when he left the ground to any point on the pole above the other hand.

The rules governing the runniug high jump must also govern the pole vault for height, except when the man leaves the ground in an attempt it shall be counted a trial.

## RULE XIX.

## Putting the Shot.

The shot must be a solid sphere, made of metal, and must weight twelve pounds.

It must be put with one hand, and in making the attempt it must be above, and not behind, the shoulder.

The competitor must stard in a circle seven feet in diameter. The cir cumference of the cirle must be divided into halves by a line drawn througn the center of the circle. On four feet of the front half of the circumference a board four inches high must be placed, the edge of which must be equally distant from the intersection of the line with the circumference, and at which the competitor must stand when the shot leaves his hand.

A fair put shall be one where no part of the person of the competitor touches in front of the circle, or on the board, in making the attempt.

A put must be counted as a foul if the competitor steps outside the circle on the board. A competitor must leave the circle by the rear half. Leaving by the front half must be declared a foul.

The measurement of all puts must be made from the nearest mark by the shot to a point on the circumference of the circle on a line with the object mark and the center of the circle.

Foul puts and letting go the shot in making an attempt must be counted as trial puts without results.

A board similar to the one in front may be used at the back of the circle.

The order of competing and the number of trials shall be the same as for the running broad jump. Shots must be furnished by the managing committee. Any contestant may use his own private shot, if correct in weight and shape; in which case the other contestants must be allowed to use it if they wish.

## RULE XXI.

## Ties.

In case of a tie in any event, the points shall be divided and the place awarded by lot.

## RULE XXII.

## Relay Racing.

1. A line must be drawn twenty feet in front of each starting line Between these two lines each runner must touch the succeeding runner. Failure to do this disqualifies the team in that event. The judges must set that all touches are properly made.
2. The same rule with reference to fouls, coaching or impeding a runt ner in any way, apply to relay racing as to other events.
3. No member of a relay team can run back of the line, nor can one man run two relays in any team.
4. The positions of the team must be drawn for.

# Constitution of the Indiana High School 

## Athletic Association

(Revised Nov. 15, 1916)

## 

## Administration

## Officers:

## Section 1. Board of Control.

a. The Board of Control shall consist of five members (principals, members of the faculiy or superintendents) to represent the five districts into which the State is divided for administration purposes only.
b. Elections shall take place each year between December 1 and December 10 , all votes being mailed to the Permanent Secretary on ballots prepared by him.
c. Each member of the I. H. S. A. A. in a district shall have one vote for a Board member from his district.
d. Beginning with December 1916 members shall be elected as follows: First District, to serve until January 1, 1918; Second District, to serve until January 1, 1919; Third District, to serve until January 1, 1920. The Fourth District will have an election in December 1917, the member to serve three years and the Fifth District will have an election in December 1918, the member to serve three years.
e. After the initial elections each member shall be elected for three years.
f. All newly elected officers shall assume the duties of their offices on the first day of January next following his election.
g. The person receiving the highest number of votes in his district shall be elected.
h. In case of a tie the vote shall be taken again, the votes being cast for the men who are tied for first place.
i. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum at any meeting.
j. Removal from the district or withdrawal from the teaching profession shall constitute a vacancy and in such cases the remaining members on the Board shall choose a person from the district wherein the vacancy exists to serve until the next election only.
k. No retiring member of the Board, having served three years, shall be eligible for re-election in any district for a period of one year after date of retirement.

## Sec. 2. I. H. S. A. A. Districts.

For the purposes of administration only the State shall be divided by Counties into the following districts :

First District-Benton, Carroll, Cass, Fulton, Jasper, Lake, Laporte, Marshall, Newton, Porter, Pulaski, Starke, St. Joseph, Tippecanoe, White.

Second District-Adams, Allen, Blackford, Dekalb, Elkhart, Grant, Howard, Huntington, Kosciusko, LaGrange, Miami, Noble, Steuben, Wabash, Wells, Whitley.
Third District-Boone, Clay, Clinton, Fountain, Hamilton, Hendricks, Marion, Montgomery, Morgan, Owen, Parke, Putnam, Tipton, Vigo, Vermillion, Warren.
Fourth District-Bartholomew, Dearborn, Decatur, Delaware, Fayette, Franklin, Hancock, Henry, Jay, Jefferson, Jennings, Johnson, Madison, Ohio, Randolph, Ripley, Rush, Shelby, Switzerland, Union, Wayne.
Fifth District-Brown, Clark, Crawford, Daviess, Dubois, Floyd, Gibson, Green, Harrison, Jackson, Knox, Lawrence, Martin, Monro, Orange, Perry, Pike, Posey, Scott, Speacer, Sullivan, Vanderburg, Warrick, Washington.
Sec. 3. The Board of Control shall have the following powers and duties: (a) It shall have general control over all athletic contests between secondary schools in this Association; (b) It shall have exclusive control of the annual Inter-scholastic Meet; (c) It shall give interpretations of the rules of the Association; (d) It shall determine forfeitures under Sec. 11; (e) The Board of Control, at the end of any athletic season may, at its discretion, issue a statement of its official opinion as to the relative standing of teams. No school which has violated the rules of the Association in regard to the qualifications of players shall be awarded special honors in that particular branch of athletics.

Sec. 4. (a) When charges are made in writing by a member of the Association against another member for violation of the rules of the Association, the Board of Control, after giving due notice of the place and time for the school so charged to be heard, shall consider such charges, and may suspend the offending school for a period not exceeding one year. (b) The Board of Control shall decide upon all protests brought before it with reference to qualifications of contestants in the Inter-scholastic Meet. (c) When any matter comes before the Board for decision which is of special interest to a school of which a member of the Board is a representative, the remaining members shall appoint another person to act in his place in that matter.

Sec. 5. At the annual meeting of 1906 a Permanent Secretary shall be elected, who shall have charge of the property and records of the Association; shall receive all money for dues and the sale of publications of the Association; shall issue all circulars anthorized by the Board of Control; shall attend meetings of the Board when requested to do so by the Board; shall turn over to the Treasurer of the Board all money in his possession when called upon to do so; shall perform such other duties as the growth of the Association as determined by the Board may require; and shall receive as compensation the sum of $\$ 150$ annually, and such allowances for expenses and clerical help as the Board may approve. Vacancies in the office may be declared by the Board for cause, and a successor appointed by the Board to act until the next annual meeting.

It shall be the duty of the Permanent Secretary to publish the I. H. S. A. A. Year Book immediately following the annual meeting of the Association

## Local Management:

Sec. 6. The Principal or his authorized representative shall accompany his team to all contests.

Sec. 7. The principal of the school, or high school teachers authorized by him, shall be manager or managers of the teams representing the school.

Sec. 8. No games shall be played without the sanction of the principal.
Sec. 9. The eligibility of all the contestants shall be certified to by the principal of the school in accordance with the rules hereby adopted. Such statements shall be presented in writing within ten days before any contest. In case of disputes the principal must furnish the Board of Control the following data in regard to each contestant: The date of last enrollment; the number of years he has been a member of a secondary school athletic team; date and place of birth; average mark in each study for the last preceding term in school; average mark in each study from the beginning of the current term or semester. A school which does not furnish this data shall be denied championship honors, and may be excluded from the Annual Interscholastic meet.

Sec. 10. The principal has power and is advised to exclude any contestant who, because of bad habits or improper conduct, would not represent his school in a becoming manner.

Sec. 11. It is recommended that principals, in arranging for games, provide a forfeit of $\$ 10$, to be exacted should there be a failure on the part of either party to carry out the arrangements made. Should such forfeitures be stipulated and not be paid during the same season, the Board of Control, after hearing both sides, shall have authority to expel the delinquent school from the Association. Notification of such expulsion shall be published in the papers, with cause therefor.

Sec. 12. Paid Coaches, other than those regularly employed as teachers by the trustees of the school, are prohibited. By paid coach is meant any person who receives, directly or indirectly, remuneration of any kind, money, traveling expenses, gifts, etc., in return for services rendered in instructing or coaching any high school athletic team.

Sec. 13. Each school in the Association shall report to the Permanent Secretary a list of pupils representing the school in athletic contests during the year. Each school is asked to report also the kind of treatment accorded them to, from and on the fieid, while guests of another school.

## Officials :

Sec. 14. On and after January 1, 1910, all the Major Officials in all athletic contests participated in by teams connected with schools in the I. H. S. A. A. shall be regularly licensed teachers in the public schools of Indiana or shall be persons whose names have been furnished and approved by the Board of Control. It is recommended that these officials shall be disinterested, and it is required that when a school demands disinterested officials at the time of scheduling the game, such officials shall be furnished. The Board shall drop from its list of approved officials any person who is palpably unfair and biased in his decision in games.

Sec. 15. Non-playing student officials or assistants shall conform to the same rules as the players.

## Membership:

Sec. 16. Membership in this Association shall be limited to public High Schools of the state, and each school shall have one vote. The annual dues shall be $\$ 1.50$, payable when the school becomes a member, and thereatter by January 1 of each year, in advance.

Academies with commissioned high school standing shall be eligible to membership in the Association, and wherever the word "high school" ap. pears in this Constitution it shall be understood to apply equally to these academies.

Beginning with the year 1914, and every year thereafter, the fiscal year of the Indiana High School Athletic Association shall close on December 31.

## Games and Game Rules:

Sec. 17. No games shall be played with high schools of this state not belonging to the Association.

This rule does not prevent a member of the Association from playing high school teams outside of the state, nor from playing non-high school teams within the state, except as follows:

It is a violation of the Constitution for schools in the Association to play non-high school teams including high school boys, unless the latter are certified as eligible by the Principal of the school to which they belong.

Sec. 18. The games recognized by the I. H. S. A. A. shall be: Football, Rugby Football, Soccer, Basketball, Track Work and Baseball. Further, all forms of inter-school athletic games shall be subject to the rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Sec. 19. In all football contests held under these rules, the length of each half shall be twenty-five minutes, unless changed by mutual consent.

Sec. 20. The basketball rules as published in Spalding's Official Basketball rule book, shall be the official rules governing all contests between members of the I. H. S. A. A. However, the rule governing the selection of officials in the above rules shall be void, and unless otherwise agreed by mutual consent, each school shall furnish one official, and these officials shall alternate their duties, each acting as referee and each acting as umpire one half.

## Rules.

## Eligibility.

Rule 1. To represent a school in any interscholastic contest, a person must be under twenty-one years of age; must have entered some public high school within the first twenty school days of the semester in which the contest occurs, and must be an amateur as defined by the A. A. U. Eighth grade pupils are not eligible. A semester is one-half a school year.
(The term "Amateur" is defined and explained in Spalding's Official Handbook of the Inter-Collegiate Association of Amateur Athletes of America.)

Rule 2. Any pupil who has been enrolled twenty (20) or more days from September 1 to December 1 of same year for each of four semesters will be ineligible to play football a fifth semester.
"Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from December 1 to March 1 of the next year for each of four
semesters shall be eligible to play a fifth semester, provided he meets the requirements of the other eligibility rules; provided further that no pupil shall represent his school longer than four years."

Interpretation-This rule applies only to students entering school for the first time during the second semester of the school year, and enrollment in school rather than participation in athletics shall determine the eligibility of all students.

Any pupil who has been enrolled for a period of twenty (20) or more days from March 1 to June 1 of the same year for each of four semesters shall be ineligible to play baseball a fifth semester.

Interpretation-This section covers all branches of athletics.
Rule 3. A pupil withdrawing permanently from school within the first twenty school days of the semester shall not be regarded as having an opportunity to engage in athletics that semester unless he has already played in one or more interscholastic games, in which case he shall be regarded as having engaged in Athletics for that season.
> - Rule 4. Post Graduates are not eligible, but pupils graduating from regular three year courses shall not be deemed post graduates.

> Rule 5. A student is a post graduate of a school after he has completed the work required for graduation by that school, irrespective of the time of granting the diploma.

Rule 6. Pupils meeting requirements for graduation in three and onehalf years in high schools with regular four years course shall be eligible to participate in school athletics the last half of the fourth year, provided they meet all other eligibility rules of the I. H. S. A. A.

Rule 7. Time spent in athletic sport by pupils while in grades below the high school shall not be counted as part of the four years.

Rule 8. No person shall enter a contest under an assumed name.
Rule 9. Any member of a high school athletic team who participates in an athletic contest as a member of any other similar team the same season, shall be ineligible to compete under these rules for the remainder of that season.

An exception is hereby made for basketball and basketball players in those towns and cities whose schools have no gymnasium and whose students are forced by necessity to use a Y. M. C. A. or some other gymnasium for their practice games. It is a well known fact that the use of such gymnasium by high school students under such circumstances will likely require that such students play on the teams of the organizations
maintaining such gymnasiums. No student, however, will be permitted to play on any other team than that representing the organization controlling the gymnasium, and no student will be allowed to play in the teams of the latter without the knowledge and consent of his principal.

Rule 10. Each contestant must have and be maintaining for the current semester, a passing grade in each of three or more studies requiring a minimum of fifteen regular high school recitations per week, exclusive of rhetoricals, physical culture, military drill and deportment; in his last preceding semester in school he must also have met the same requirements throughout the entire term.

Pupils enrolled for the first time must comply with the requirements of the rules, the average standing required for the preceding semester being obtained from the records in the last secondary school attended.

Back work may be made up, providing that it is done in accordance with the regular rules of the school and becomes a matter of final record before the next semester.

Interpretation-In each of the studies representing the minimum requirement of work specified above: (a) For the current semester the average of the monthly grades up to the time of certification must be passing; (b) for the current or school month the average of the daily or weekly grades must be passing; (c) if the average of the monthly grades at the beginning of any month is below passing in any study, the pupil is ineligible as far as that study is concerned for the entire month.

Rule 11. No person who has been enrolled as a student in an institution of college standing, and has done work which may be coun ed toward a degree in that institution, shall be eligible as a member of any athletic team under I. H. S. A. A. rules in any game with any other team, either within or without the State of Indiana.

Rule 12. The eligibility rules of this Association shall apply to students taking part in all contests, whether with schools inside or outside the State of Indiana.

Rule 13. On and after January 1, 1911, no student shall be eligible to play football unless he has been examined by a regular physician and his physical condition has been pronounced satisfactory. Further, such student shall not be eligible until the physician's certificate has been filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. Said certificate shall be good from September 1 to December 1, only.

Rule 14. On and after January 1, 1911, no pupil shall be eligible to play football without the written consent of his father, mother or guardian. Said written consent shall be attested by the Principal or Faculty Manager,
and shall be filed with the Permanent Secretary of the Association. The copy of said written consent shall be attached to the physician's certificate when filed with the Permanent Secretary.

## Interpretations

First. A game is any athletic contest where an admission fee is charged, or where any collection or contribution is received from spectators.

Second. The football season is defined as beginning with the opening of school and closing with November 30.

Third. No student who violates the rules of the Association will be reinstated by the Board.

Fourth. A pupil who has played in one or more interscholastic games in any season shall be regarded as having engaged in athletics for that season.

Fifth. When a member or members of any team are protested, the game should be played as scheduled and the protest filed with the Board for settlement later.

Sixth. The basketball season is defined as lasting the entire school year.

Seventh. Pupils under twenty-one at the time of registration in school shall be so regarded until the time of their next registration.

Eighth. Any student, who carries at least 15 hours of regular High School work, is a High School student.

Ninth. It is recommended that Principals take proper measures to control the crowd and the players in all contests. Failure to do so shall be considered sufficient grounds for expulsion from the Association.

Please state definitely the kind and number of each wanted.
