APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE SPORTSMANSHIP TASK FORCE

Assistant Commissioner Walter presented a list of proposals recommended by the IHSAA Sportsmanship Task Force.

1. Submission/Presentation required of each member school with a Sportsmanship score falling into one of the three unacceptable categories: Watch, Probation, Needs Improvement.
 - a. Final Sportsmanship Score calculations will take place immediately following the baseball state finals and the IHSAA Student Leadership Conference.
 - b. Notice sent from IHSAA Commissioner to: Superintendent, Principal, and Athletic Director. All will be required to participate.
 - c. Submissions/Presentations of Sportsmanship Evaluation template will be required on or before the August Executive Meeting. A sportsmanship Evaluation template will be provided by the IHSAA to each Member School.

- d. Timeline for Improvement: The following academic school year.
- e. The IHSAA will monitor progress of member schools throughout the following year.
 - “**Watch**” Category (89-70): Member School to **complete** the Sportsmanship Evaluation form and submit to the Commissioner of the IHSAA.
 - “**Probation**” Category (69-60): Member School to participate in a **video conference** with the IHSAA Commissioner and Staff.
 - “**Needs Improvement**” Category (<60): Member School must make a **formal presentation to the IHSAA Executive Committee** utilizing the Sportsmanship Evaluation form.
- 2. Seasonal Sportsmanship Report - A seasonal report will be published and sent to the membership. The report will include each Member School’s number of reports, the Sportsmanship Score to date, and the current sportsmanship level
- 3. Notice of Unsporting Behavior Reports
 - a. All ejections will be sent to **Principal and Athletic Director** via automatic email notification from the office of the IHSAA.
 - b. Unsporting reports (yellow cards, technical fouls, etc.) will be sent to the Athletic Director via automatic email notification from the office of the IHSAA.
 - c. Schools shall be notified when there is an exorbitant accumulation (10 or more) of unsporting behavior reports.
 - d. First unsporting report of school year, post presentation – The IHSAA Staff will directly communicate with the offending school relative to the infraction.
 - e. First ejection of following year, post presentation - The IHSAA Staff will directly communicate with the offending school relative to the infraction.
- 4. Methods of Notice - Sportsmanship Program/Requirements
 - a. Point of emphasis at Area Principal Meetings
 - b. Posting via IHSAA websites: .org, .net, Central Hub
 - c. IHSAA Press Release to media and Coaches Association
 - d. Point of emphasis at the IIAAA District Meetings

A motion to approve the recommendations of the Sportsmanship Task Force was made by Steve Cox; seconded by Mike Broughton; motion approved 16-0.

APPROVE PROPOSAL TO ALLOW EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO RENAME SELECTED MENTAL ATTITUDE AWARDS

Commissioner Cox presented a proposal to allow the Executive Committee to rename selected Mental Attitude Award. After considerable discussion, a motion to rename the Mental Attitude Award in Football Classes 1A, 2A, and 3A after Blake Ress, and to name for Mental Attitude Award in Boys Basketball Class 1A after Ray Craft was made by Nathan Dean; seconded by Geoff Penrod; motion approved 16-0.

APPROVE THE FORMATION OF THE IHSAA FOUNDATION

Commissioner Cox presented a proposal to establish an IHSAA Foundation. The objective of the IHSAA Foundation is to augment the services of the IHSAA to its member schools and student athletes by providing funding to support scholarships, projects, and initiatives which promote education based athletics.

STATUS OF CATASTROPHIC, GENERAL LIABILITY AND EXCESS LIABILITY INSURANCE POLICIES FOR 2015-16

Assistant Commissioner Faulkens presented a report of the progress in obtaining bids for catastrophic liability, general liability, excess liability, and directors and officer’s insurance coverage. Mr. Faulkens reported that the cost of the catastrophic liability insurance will remain the same in 2015-16, the general liability and excess liability costs will go down 9%, and he is currently waiting for bids regarding director’s and officer’s insurance coverage.

SPORTSMANSHIP

Assistant Commissioner Walter reported that the Association had received 3460 reports of unsporting behavior and 498 ejections for 2014-15. This is an improvement over the previous year’s figures. Assistant Commissioner Walter also reported on member school’s sportsmanship scores. Final tabulations will be made following the compilation of schools attending the IHSAA Student Leadership Conference.

LITIGATION

Attorney Robert Baker updated the Executive Committee on the current status of pending litigation against the Association.

PENALTIES ASSESSED

The following penalties were assessed for various violations of the IHSAA By-Laws:

Alexandria Monroe High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Girls' track athlete participated in multiple meets while academically ineligible.*)

1. Alexandria Monroe High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Girls' track athlete participated in multiple meets while academically ineligible.*) The Alexandria Monroe High School girls' track and field program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored after removing the scores of the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Bedford North Lawrence High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-2.5 (*An eighth grade girl from a non-feeder school participated in an open facility program.*)

1. The Bedford North Lawrence High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. Head Coach Jeff Allen is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. The head coach retains the responsibility of insuring that all programming offered in his sport is in compliance with IHSAA by-laws.

Bluffton High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-1.2a (*Softball player participated in a non-school sponsored contest*)

1. The Bluffton High School softball program is issued a warning.
2. The student has been suspended multiple games by the school for this infraction.

Bowman Leadership Academy – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Baseball player participated in multiple games without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Bowman Leadership Academy baseball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Bowman Leadership Academy was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School– Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Baseball player participated in multiple games without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Brebeuf Jesuit baseball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Brebeuf Jesuit was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School– Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Softball player participated in multiple games without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Brebeuf Jesuit softball program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.

3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Brebeuf Jesuit was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Columbus North High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 15-2.2 (*Four volleyball players participated on the same non-school sponsored team simultaneously*)

1. The Columbus North High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. The players involved in the violation shall be suspended for one Columbus North High School volleyball match during the 2015-16 season. These suspensions may be spread out over the first four regular season contests.
3. Head Coach Caitlan Greiner is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. The head coach holds the responsibility for the adherence of all IHSAA by-laws by players and coaches.

Crawford County High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Girls' track athlete participated in multiple meets while academically ineligible*)

1. The Crawford County High School girls' track and field program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored after removing the scores of the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Evansville Day School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Girls' track athlete participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Evansville Day School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.
2. In accordance with Rule 14-1 of the IHSAA By-Laws the contest shall be forfeited if Evansville Day School was victorious and Heritage Hills High School shall be notified of this violation.

Franklin Central High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 18-1 (*Football player participated in multiple contests while academically ineligible*)

1. The Franklin Central High School football program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which this ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Franklin Central was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Franklin Central High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-10 (*Two football players participated the entire season without approved pre-participation physical examination and consent forms on file – PROBATION*)

1. The Franklin Central High School football program is placed on probation for the 2015-16 season. This probation is a severe type of warning. It is official notice that serious violations have occurred, are a matter of record and future, similar incidents will not be tolerated.
2. Coach Burt Austin is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. This is a health and safety issue and it is absolutely imperative that the "IHSAA Pre-Participation Evaluation Form" complete in every detail be on file for all student athletes prior to their participation in a practice, let alone an interscholastic competition.
3. The students involved in this violation are declared ineligible until such time the students provide a valid pre-participation physical and consent forms to the school.

4. The interscholastic contests in which these ineligible athletes participated in shall be forfeited if Franklin Central was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Franklin Central High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 3-10 (*Two boys' tennis players participated the entire season without approved pre-participation physical examination and consent forms on file*)

1. The Franklin Central High School boys' tennis program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Robert Kleeman is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. This is a health and safety issue and it is absolutely imperative that the "IHSAA Pre-Participation Evaluation Form" complete in every detail be on file for all student athletes prior to their participation in a practice, let alone an interscholastic competition.
3. The students involved in this violation are declared ineligible until such time the students provide a valid pre-participation physical and consent forms to the school.
4. The interscholastic contests in which these ineligible athletes participated in shall be rescored to remove the ineligible athletes' contributions to the team score. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

Franklin Central High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Girls' track athlete participated in multiple meets without an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report on file*)

1. The Franklin County High School girls' track and field program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved foreign exchange student eligibility report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be rescored to remove any points scored by the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Glenn High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of Rule 19-3 (*Girls' track and field athlete participated in multiple meets without an approved transfer report on file*)

1. The Glenn High School girls' track and field program is issued a warning.
2. The student athlete involved in this violation shall be suspended and declared ineligible until an approved transfer report is on file.
3. The contests in which the ineligible athlete participated in shall be rescored to remove any points scored by the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be notified of this violation.

Hamilton Southeastern High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 15-2.2a (*Four previously rostered volleyball players participated together on the same non-school sponsored team*)

1. The Hamilton Southeastern High School volleyball program is issued a warning.
2. The players involved in the violation shall be suspended for one Hamilton Southeastern High School volleyball match during the 2015-16 season. These suspensions may be spread out over the first four regular season contests.
3. Head Coach Jason Young is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. The head coach holds the responsibility for the adherence of all IHSAA by-laws by players and coaches.

Huntington North High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 15-2.2d (*JV girls' basketball coach instructed two players on a non-school sponsored team*)

1. The Huntington North High School girls' basketball program is issued a warning.

2. Junior Varsity Coach Tenessa Pontius is reprimanded for committing this violation. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable excuse for a rules violation.

Lebanon High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 14-1 (*School used an unlicensed official in a varsity baseball contest*)

1. The Lebanon High School baseball program is issued a warning. This warning is official notice that a rule violation has occurred, is a matter of record, and shall not be repeated.
2. In accordance with Rule 14-1 of the IHSAA By-Laws the school shall remit a penalty of \$500.00 to the IHSAA for this infraction. The contest is not forfeited.

Michigan City High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 18-1 (*Softball player participated in multiple contests while academically ineligible*)

1. The Michigan City High School softball program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which this ineligible athlete participated in shall be forfeited if Michigan City was victorious. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

North Judson San-Pierre High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 18-1 (*Boys' golfer participated in multiple meets while academically ineligible*)

1. The North Judson-San Pierre High School boys' golf program is issued a warning.
2. The student involved in this violation is declared ineligible until such time the student may become academically eligible.
3. The interscholastic contests in which the ineligible athlete participated shall be rescored after removing the scores of the ineligible athlete. The opposing schools shall be made aware of this violation.

South Spencer High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 19-3 (*Two students participated in multiple soccer and softball contests without approved transfer reports on file*)

1. The South Spencer girls' soccer and softball programs are issued a warning.
2. The student athletes involved in this violation as of May 8, 2015 both have approved transfer reports on file.
3. All regular season contests in which these ineligible athletes participated in shall be forfeited if South Spencer was victorious and the opposing schools shall be notified of these violations.

Union (Modoc) High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 3-9.4a (*Girls' softball player participated in tournament series event while not appearing on the sectional entry list*)

1. The Union High School softball program is issued a warning.
2. Coach Jeff Burke is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. Only those players listed on the official entry should even be allowed to dress for the tournament series; they certainly should not be allowed to participate.
3. It is strongly suggested that future sectional entry lists be reviewed with the utmost care and posted conspicuously in locker rooms for student athletes to review before submission to the IHSAA.

Western Boone High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 15-2.5 (*Girls' soccer player from a different school participated in a school sponsored open facility program*)

1. The Western Boone High School girls' soccer program is issued a warning.

2. Coach Jennifer Foxworthy is reprimanded for allowing this violation to occur. Ignorance of the rules is not an acceptable excuse for a violation.

Westfield High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 15-2.5 (*Two boys' basketball players from a different school participated in a school sponsored open facility program*)

1. The Westfield High School boys' basketball program is issued a warning.

Whiting High School – Commissioner Cox reported the following action as a result of a violation of 15-1.2a (*Softball player participated in a non-school sponsored game*)

1. The Whiting High School softball program is issued a warning.
2. The student has been removed from the team for the remainder of the season. The IHSAA supports this suspension and deems it appropriate and fulfilling for the penalty incurred.
