Seventeen Undefeated Wrestlers Aiming for State Titles

New Palestine's Chad Red Looking to become Four-Time State Champion

Ten individuals who have won state championships including nine from last year head the field of wrestlers into the 78th Annual IHSAA Wrestling State Finals this weekend at Bankers Life Fieldhouse in Indianapolis.

Two hundred twenty-four wrestlers in all, 16 in each of the 14 weight classes, will begin first round competition on Friday at 6 pm ET / 5 pm CT. First-round winners will return to wrestle on Saturday with quarterfinal action beginning at 9:30 am ET / 8:30 am CT and semifinal matches to follow after all weight classes have concluded. Consolation bouts begin at 5 pm ET and championship matches under the spotlight are scheduled for 7:30 pm ET.

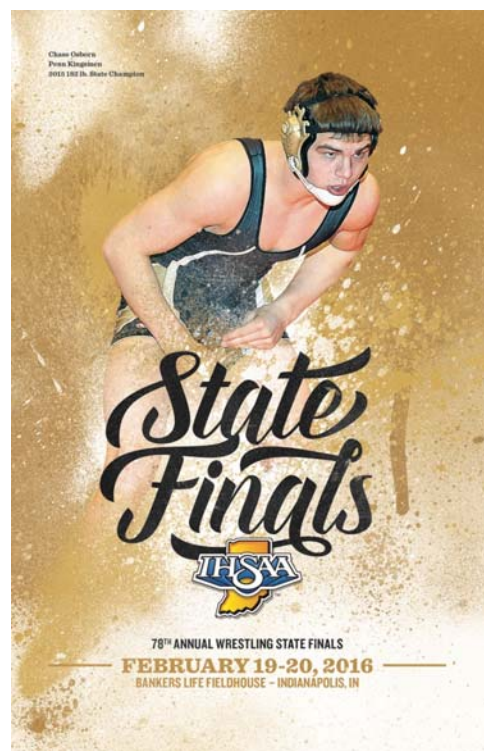
The quest to become a four-time state champion is the goal of New Palestine's Chad Red. The senior hopes to become the ninth four-time champion in state history and first since Crown Point's Jason Tsirtsis polished off his fourth in 2012. Red also enters the weekend undefeated in his career at 179-0 (40-0 this season) and would become just the third to finish all four years without a loss joining Indianapolis Cathedral's Lance Ellis (172-0 from 1986-89) and Griffith's Alex Tsirtsis (Jason's older brother) (236-0 from 2001-04). Red would also join Alex Tsirtsis as the only undefeated wrestlers to win four titles in four different weight classes. Tsirtsis won his at 119, 130, 135 and 145. Red has won at 106, 120 and 126 and hopes to add the 132 title this weekend.

He could meet Evansville Mater Dei's Nick Lee on Saturday night if both advance. Lee (13-0 on the season), ranked second nationally behind Red in his weight class, is the defending state champion at 132 winning last year's crown finishing 35-0.

Eight others that have stood atop the podium return as well. By weight class they are: Colton Cummings of Lowell at 113; Jeremiah Reitz of Griffith at 120; Brock Hudkins of Danville at 126; Jacob Covaciu of Merrillville at 160; Drew Hughes of Lowell at 170; Blake Rypel of Indianapolis Cathedral at 182; Kobe Woods of Penn at 220 and; Shawn Streck of Merrillville at 285.

The overall team state champion will be decided on points scored at this tournament where Penn enters as the defending state champion after capturing the trophy for the first time a year ago.

Fans are welcome to follow the progress of the meet as first round, quarterfinal and semifinal action on each mat will be streamed for a fee via TrackWrestling.com. Saturday night's championship matches will be televised on Fox Sports Indiana (FSI) and streamed on IHSAAtv.org to those outside the FSI footprint. The championships will be hosted Mark Jaynes, Mike Goebel and Greg Rakestraw.



One hundred ten (110) schools will be represented at this weekend's state finals with Warren Central's eight qualifiers and seven each from Brownsburg, Penn, Portage leading the way. Brownsburg and Warren Central led the state with six and four semi-state champions last weekend, respectively.

Team scoring will begin with Friday night's preliminary matches for the first time this year. Scoring will go to eight places and, additionally, two (2) advancement points will be awarded per match for a championship bracket victory while one (1) point is earned for advancement in the consolation bracket.

Finally, points will be awarded to the top eight place-winners: 1st place: 16 points; 2nd place: 12 points; 3rd place: 9 points; 4th place: 7 points; 5th place: 5 points; 6th place: 3 points; 7th place: 2 points; 8th place: 1 point.

Media Information

Media Credentials: Deadline is Thursday, Feb. 18, at 4 pm ET / 3 pm CT. Please note that the 2015-16 IHSAA State Finals Media Credential will NOT allow admission to this event as a specific credential is required – no exceptions. Legitimate working news media should apply for credentials by e-mailing (with name of individual applying) IHSAA Sports Information Director Jason Wille at jwille@ihsaa.org. E-mail requests MUST originate from a recognized business account; e-mails from personal accounts (ie: gmail.com, yahoo.com, aol.com, etc.) will not be accepted. Approved requests will be left to claim by the individual at media will-call at Bankers Life Fieldhouse beginning at 3 pm ET on Friday. Identification is necessary to pick up credentials.

Media Parking: There is no designated parking area for media for this event though there are numerous parking options within a short distance of Bankers Life Fieldhouse. The Virginia Street parking garage, which charges a fee, is directly to the east of the venue.

Media Entrance: The media entrance is in the southeast corner of Bankers Life Fieldhouse adjacent to Delaware Street. The door is marked for Employees and Media and is located at the opposite end of the building from the public entrance. Please allow a few extra minutes to pass through security. Media credentials left at will-call are to be claimed at this entrance.

Media Work Room: As in previous years, the media workroom at Bankers Life Fieldhouse will be open both days and be available to working media members throughout Friday evening and all day on Saturday. The work area contains complimentary wireless internet access. Hospitality will be available.

Fieldhouse WiFi: Wireless communications is complimentary at Bankers Life Fieldhouse, using the "Fieldhouse WiFi" signal. A remodeled Fieldhouse wireless system capably serves all wireless antennas of 5.0 ghz. Those with older devices may not receive a wireless signal. Also, due to conflicting frequencies, the Bankers Life Fieldhouse wireless system prohibits the use of WiFi hot spots (i.e. "MiFi"). Personal hotspots will not be functional.

Mat Access: As in years past, Bankers Life Fieldhouse will have the hockey boards set up around the perimeter of the wrestling mat area. During the championship round only on Saturday night will credentialed photographers be allowed inside the hockey boards to shoot action mat-side. Other than that, only participants, coaches and fieldhouse workers will have access to the mat area.

Programs: Copies of the official program containing brackets for each weight class and tournament history will be available in the Media Work Room.

Results: Will be updated continuously throughout both days of the tournament via **TrackWrestling.com**. Copies of the updated brackets will also be available in the media work room throughout the two days.

Jasper's Kevin Huelsman to be honored with Officiating Award

Kevin Huelsman of Jasper is the recipient of the 2016 Interscholastic Athletic Official Award for excellence in the sport of wrestling.

Each year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association, in cooperation with the National Federation of Interscholastic Officials Association, recognizes and honors an outstanding official in each of 11 sports during the school year.

After being licensed for 24 years, Kevin has officiated six Individual and five Team State Finals in Wrestling, and he was also an umpire for the 2008 Baseball State Finals.

Kevin is a member of the Southwestern Officials Association, where he has served as both the Wrestling and Baseball chairperson. He was selected for this honor by a committee representing the official's associations across Indiana.

About the Indiana High School Athletic Association, Inc. (IHSAA)

The IHSAA is a voluntary, not-for-profit organization that is self-supporting without the use of tax monies. Since its founding in 1903, the Association's mission has been to provide wholesome, educational athletics for the secondary schools of Indiana. Its member high schools - public, institutional, parochial and private - pay no annual membership fee or incur entry fees to play in the Association's tournaments. A state tournament series is conducted annually in 21 sports, 10 for girls, 10 for boys and one co-ed (unified track and field). A 19-person board of directors, elected by member school principals, governs the organization.
