The state's best in high school track and field converge in Bloomington this weekend as the IHSAA conducts the 116th Boys State Finals on Friday, the Sixth Unified State Finals in partnership with Special Olympics Indiana, and the 46th Boys State Finals on Saturday. Each meet will be contested at the Robert C. Haugh Track and Field Complex on the campus of Indiana University with field events beginning at 3 pm ET and running events at 4:15 pm ET each day while the Unified festivities will get underway Saturday at 11:30 am ET.

The boys meet, the oldest event in any sport sponsored by the IHSAA dating back to 1904, is without any returning state champions while the girls meet has nine returning winners, all in different events.

Hamilton Southeastern's Noah Malone is the top seed in both the 100 (10.61) and 200 (21.48) meters while Indianapolis Cathedral's Cole Hocker, last fall's boys cross country state champion, is the top seed in both the 800 (1:51.75) and 1600 meter (4:11.62) events.

Lawrence North's Nathan Stone (17-0.75) could be a threat to the pole vault state record of 17-6 on Friday afternoon.

In the girls meet, Noblesville's Shelby Tyler (5-9) and Hamilton Southeastern's Kennedy Drish (12-6) are both top seeds and looking for their third consecutive state championships in the high jump and pole vault, respectively.

Beauf Jesuit senior Semira Killebrew leads the field in both the 100 (11.89) in which she is the defending champ, and the 200 (24.05).

UNIFIED NOTABLES

For the sixth year, the Indiana High School Athletic Association (IHSAA) will host the Unified Track & Field State Finals as part of its 'Champions Together' partnership with Special Olympics Indiana (SOIN) on Saturday morning in Bloomington.

The Unified State Finals begin at 11:30 am ET - 30 minutes earlier than last year - and consist of six events including 100 meters, 400 meters, 400 meter relay (separate heats for each gender), shot put and long jump. Admission is \$10 and also gains entry into the IHSAA Girls Track & Field State Finals which begins at 3 pm ET.

With the program continuing to grow across the state, the field of qualifying teams has increased by two this year. The 12 schools that make up this year's field include Bedford North Lawrence, Bloomington North, Carroll (Fort Wayne), Columbus North, Elkhart Memorial, Fishers, Jasper, Jennings County, McCutcheon, New Albany, Penn, Valparaiso.

Last year's state champion, Elkhart Memorial, which won the school's first crown a year ago, will look to repeat as champion as it took first place in last weekend's Kokomo Regional to be among the top six advancing teams. Teamwork is an emphasis in unified sports thus an overall team state championship is awarded rather than individual awards.

Unified Sports enables persons with and without intellectual disabilities to participate on the same team for sports training and competition. All participants in Saturday's festivities have qualified as part of their team rather than as individuals.

For the sixth year, schools individually scheduled regular season competitions that culminated with the IHSAA state tournament. While the IHSAA provided the framework for the competition, including rules and officials, Special Olympics Indiana provided technical support to schools participating in Unified Track and Field, as well as financial grants to a number of schools to assist with costs.

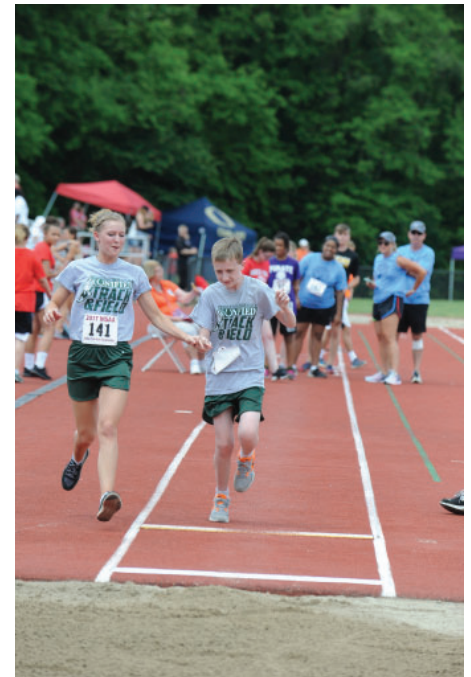
